From the Principal

A Scopus education has always been about much more than exam results. It encompasses the development of the whole personality, together with an understanding of our students' responsibilities and privileges as Jews and Australians.

These extra-curricular opportunities include an extensive interschool sports program, debating competitions, music teaching and performances and many other areas of communal involvement. One such field that has seen a significant expansion in recent years is school drama.

With the outstanding facilities provided in the Besen Family Performing Arts Centre, and the relocated Susie and Eric Stock

Drama Studio for smaller-scale events, Scopus students now present a large repertoire of theatrical events.

Next year will see the third biennial Primary musical that gives a part to every student from Years 3 to 6. The Secondary Musical continues to be the jewel in the Performing Arts crown, and 2012's production of *Oliver* looks set to continue the tradition of quality that would make a professional company proud.

But not every student can sing or dance, and the Musical does not always create enough space to develop our students' dramatic skills. For these reasons the Secondary School Play was introduced as an annual fixture – a challenging production, ranging thus far from Arthur

Miller to Greek tragedy that showcases and refines thespian talent to the highest level. The repertoire is completed by the Year 12 Theatre Studies play, which students create for themselves as part of their VCE studies, and the Middle School house plays, which give younger students the opportunity to script, choreograph, direct and produce their team's performance.

With this range of shows providing everything from the chance to enjoy being part of a team backstage to a springboard for a potentially professional career in theatre, and everything in between, as well as enjoyable and thought-provoking events for the audiences, Drama indeed now takes a prominent place on the Scopus stage.

Record participation in Ulpan



2011-2012 YEAR 10 ULPAN PARTICIPANTS

A record participation rate in the voluntary Ulpan programs will see Israel come alive for over 80% of Year 10 students this year.

The first group, on the 11 week program, flew out in late October to spend six weeks studying, working and living on kibbutzim in the Beit Shean area. In December they were joined by students on the five week program and both groups toured Prague together, as they gained an insight into the once thriving Jewish communities of Eastern Europe.

Returning to Israel they are currently enjoying a busy five weeks of classes, tours and volunteer work. A special emphasis this year is on 'hasbara' with students taking part in seminars and discussions to gain a greater understanding of both sides of the Israel-Arab conflict.

Elcho Island cultural exchange

At the end of last semester, a group of Year 9 students headed to Darwin on the first leg of a new Community and Service program. This exciting program took them to Elcho Island (Galiwin'ku), a remote indigenous community which is part of the Arnhem Land indigenous region. The program offered students an Australian based alternative to the Cambodia Year 9 Community and Service trip.

The value in this active cultural exchange proved immeasurable, as students were immersed in the culture of the Yolngu people and authentically involved in their community, which maintains a strong cultural identity and where English is a second language.

By living alongside the people of Elcho Island, students were enveloped in the warm physical and emotional embrace of the children of Shepherdson College, and were able to absorb aspects of the Yolngu people's language. Our students participated in arts and culturally specific practices and traditions such as fibre dying and Pandanas weaving, and spear making, and in return shared Israeli dancing, culturally iconic mural painting and sport activities. On the last night, our students were invited to a community ceremony where stories were shared through indigenous dance and music.

The aim of the exchange was for our students to use their own talents, share aspects of Jewish values, share cultural resources and exchange friendships.

Cambodia

In its third year, the Year 9 Community and Service trip to Cambodia proved this year to be the most physically challenging. Students visited three different regions of Cambodia and made their mark in each.

In Siem Reap, they planted 24 mango trees at a remote school. In a few years these will provide fruit for the children and any extra will be sold to provide much needed income for the school. Before leaving the area, the group visited a village hospital, where, due to a generous donation from a Scopus family, they were able to provide baby wraps and blankets to the newly opened maternity room.

The next stop was Battambang, where students built two much needed classrooms for the Child Hope Organisation, which assists the neediest children in the area by providing classes in English, computer skills and communication skills. Our students hammered in the walls and roof and even gave the whole structure a coat of paint before the day was done.

In Phnom Penh the group visited S-21 Prison and the Killing Fields, where they gained an insight into the dark history of Cambodia. Then, collecting their hammers one last time, they headed to a rural village to build four houses. Now 'experienced' in the art of hammering nails, the team did an incredible job and were able to hand over the houses to their new owners by lunch time.

They had certainly earned their Shabbat rest and were able to sponsor a Shabbat dinner for 70 people at Chabad House in Phnom Penh.
